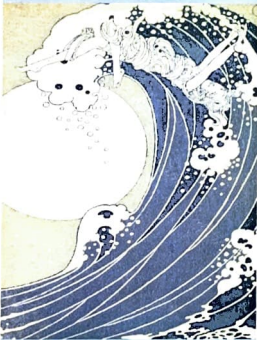

TRAILER TIRES

When I was at the boat show this year I was looking at the boats that our members had brought to the show. I noticed that some of the trailers had automobile tires on them. You spend untold hours rebuilding, repairing, varnishing, polishing, and caring for your beautiful boat and YOU put AUTOMOBILE TIRES on your trailer...

ARE YOU CRAZY ???

DO YOU WANT TO LEAVE A BIG PILE OF WOOD SPLINTERS IN THE MIDDLE OF THE HIGHWAY!!!

Automobile tires have a very thin side wall, about the thickness of the side of a styro-foam cup. That is not very thick. What is needed for your trailer are tires that are made for trailers. The side walls are thicker and are designed to take the swaying back and forth that a trailer does. On the side wall of a trailer tire you will find a big S T , this means SPECIAL TRAILER. This tire will take the side loads that will be imposed on it by your boat and trailer.

Now that we are on the subject of tires, lets talk about tire AGE. The age of your tires. The R V industry says that if your tires are over SIX to SEVEN years old, they should be replaced!!! Take a look at the picture, I know what I am talking about!!! This tires looked brand new, had tread a mile deep, but was nine years old. I almost lost the boat and the motor home that I was using to tow it with. When the tire blew the steering went wild. After I managed to get stopped we were cross wise on the highway and it took me about 30 minutes before I could talk. Both fenders were torn off of the trailer and all four wheels had struck the hull of the boat. Inside where the tires had hit the hull it looked like four little bombs had exploded, I was SICK.

So if you DON'T have TRAILER TIRES on your trailer, remember S T . Or if your tires are SIX YEARS OR OLDER PLEASE REPLACE THEM !!! It is a lot easier to replace tires than your BOAT that you just finished rebuilding.

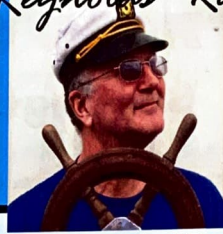

Bruce Reynolds, winner of multiple "Best Engine Compartment" awards and restoration expert, stops polishing his propeller long enough to give our readers some advice...

Gas is getting more expensive, so here are some tips on running your boat efficiently:

- Keep your engine tuned to burn less gas
- Get the right size propeller—one which puts the motor in the upper half of the RPM range
- Check your prop for weeds wound around it Smooth out rough edges or small nicks with a medium grade of sandpaper
- Balance your load—rearrange your gear and passengers so less horsepower is required to keep the bow up and out of water.

ACBS Scholarship Endowment Fund

2010 Membership Renewal Form, Scholarship Endowment Fund, Moving your IRA Funds to a Charity and Planned Giving

2010 Membership Renewal

The Society has made donating to the Scholarship Endowment Fund easy this year by including a donation area on the renewal form. There are three suggested donations which you can tick and then add your donation to the total column on the form. Tax receipts will be issued for all donations over \$25.

Chapter Donations to the Scholarship Endowment Funds

A number of ACBS chapters have generously donated to the Scholarship Endowment Fund in 2009. As of November 1st donations had been received from Blue Ridge, Chesapeake Bay, Manotick, Sunnyland and Toronto chapters.

Moving IRA Funds to a Charity

2009 might be the last year you will have an opportunity to move IRA funds to a charity and avoid federal income tax.

Part of the Pension Protection Act is the IRA Rollover provision. This provision allows otherwise taxable distributions of up to \$100,000 from a traditional IRA to be excluded from gross income. The legislation offers incentive to donors who want to use the money in their IRAs to make charitable gifts.

Donors to whom the new IRA rollover likely will appeal include:

- * Those currently giving at their 50% deduction limit
- * Those whose income level causes the phase out of their exemptions
- * Those for whom additional income will cause more of their Social Security income to be taxed

To qualify for IRA rollover treatment, the donor must be at least 70½, and must direct the IRA manager to transfer the funds directly to charity. The gift must be outright—rollovers to a planned gift, such as a gift annuity or a charitable remainder trust, do not qualify. As in previous versions of IRA rollover legislation, there is no federal income tax deduction available for these contributions in addition to their exclusion from income.

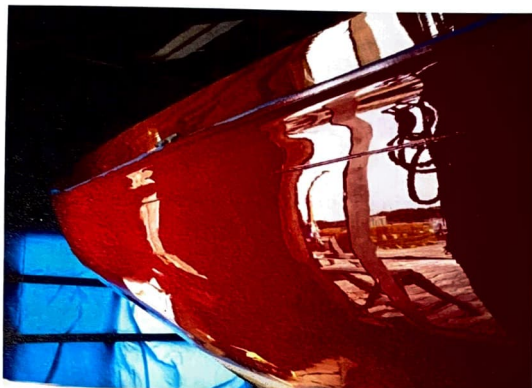

Good Brushes Deserve Good Care

What is the best way to care for your high end varnish brush?

Although the tendency to use a foam brush for the ultimate in convenience may be great, and for quick build-up coats (Bruce Reynolds, BK, Steve Z. and I do use foam brushes too)...but wait!..hold the presses!..there is absolutely nothing as satis-

fying as a good quality, natural bristle varnish brush. A true high end varnish brush can set you back as much as \$50 smackers or more! When selecting the right brush watch for the following:

A true varnish brush will have slightly shorter bristles in order to "bite" into a heavier product like marine varnish. This makes for a slightly stiffer bristle. Check the bristle ends. A good brush will have split ends (just like a split hair). Watch for the way the bristles have been cut or chiseled. This will determine how well the brush will smooth the varnish as well as how well it will draw the air from the finish. It is difficult to determine how the bristles have been set. Epoxy is normal, and the ultra high quality brushes are vulcanized rubber. Ensure that the ferule (metal band) is well put together. Hopefully, the material used is stainless. If the brush has passed the test so far, chances are the handle is hardwood. At the very least, the quality of the handle will be a good indicator as to the standard used in constructing the rest of the brush. New brushes are amazingly dirty! Take some time to break in a new brush. Use it and clean it out several times with mineral spirits, NOTE: never use regular paint thinner from the box stores as it is also very dirty. Keep in mind it may take many sessions to really get it clean. I have brushes that are reserved for final coat only. I still spend up to an hour cleaning a brush prior to a final coat. Sit in front of the TV and flick the bristles back and forth. In front of a bright light, you will be amazed at what will come out of it....for real...do this!

The best way to store a good brush is to keep it wet, suspended in diesel fuel or kerosene. Oooo yes, I said good ole diesel. Nothing works better as far as I am concerned (and most quality brush makers also). Diesel is oily enough to keep the bristles nice and soft while still having enough cutting capability to keep the brush clean. I have a brush that is easily ten years old. Prior to varnishing, clean the diesel from the brush with mineral spirits, rinsing and spinning several times. Once done repeat the process. Your brush will be as happy as a clam in a diesel or kerosene bath. Change the diesel once or twice a year and fuggaboudit!.

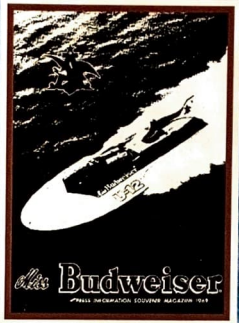
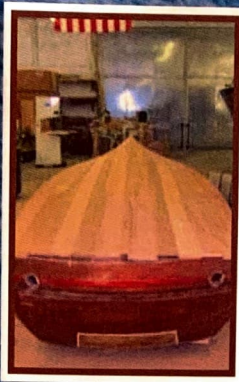

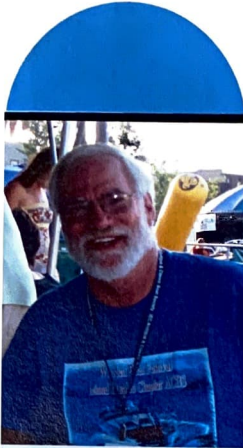

Membership Report

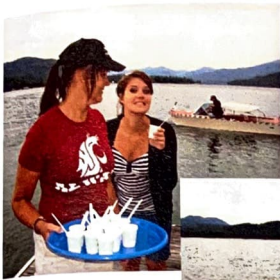
Terry & Mariette Deems—Membership Co-Chairs

Mariette and I have recently sent out quite a few applications to possible new members, and we should see them added to the

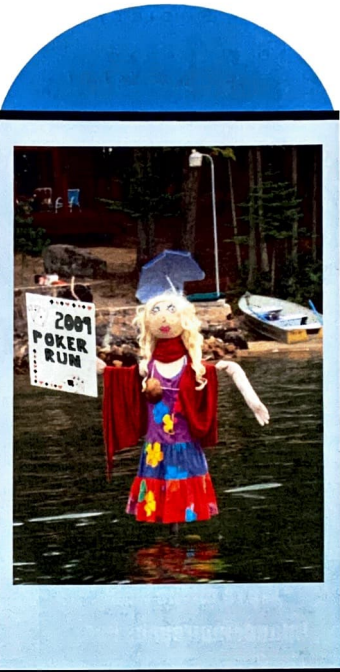

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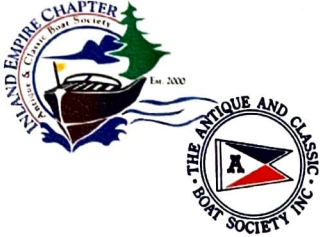
