














Above is the Ariel Shot of The Sandpoint Marina and the Powerhouse Bar & Grill as well as the launch.

What is it about old boats, old cars and old guys? To see the beauty of a restored classic car or boat seems to bring out a lot of old memories. Nostalgia for a simpler time is the draw for some. Memories of an uncle, grandfather, or friend who had a boat "just like that one" for others. In their eyes you see a quick trip down memory lane as they gaze at these wooden wonders. For the owners of such classics it goes much deeper. True, for some of the proud owners, their original attraction was to recapture a time of their youth. For others the thrill is to take an old derelict, lost & forgotten behind some barn and bring it back to its original glory. 
Entry # 339 **"Rio Rita"** 1930 Clift Motor Company owned by Alan & Yvonne Thomle of Stanwood, WA.

Entry # 331 "Patrician" 1957 Chris Craft Constellation owned by Jon P. Molander of Colbert, WA This boat was purchased by Jon's Grandfather in 1958 and was moved to Bayview for 26 years. This one is truly and original.



Entry # 333 "Hare Razor" 1954 Stancraft Utility owned by Bill Coyle & Jan Love of Spokane, WA. This is an original Stancraft built by Stan Young in 1954. Bill is the 3<sup>rd</sup> owner and they have had her fully reconditioned in 2002 to be an all around ski and pleasure craft.



Entry # 334 "Moody Blue" 1962 Shepard Deluxe owned by Bruce and Glenda Middleton of Kelowna, B.C. This boat was built in Niagara on the Lake Ontario in 1962. It spent its whole life out west in BC. Bruce bought the boat in 1993 and restored her over the next 4 summers. She has a new west system type bottom and some side plan planking but is otherwise original. Entry # 332 "Lady Silkforth" 1951 Chris Craft Riviera owned by Gary Hammond of Pasco, WA. This boat was originally on Flathead Lake. It has been through a 2 ½ year Restoration by Andrew Middleton of Kelowna B.C. It is nice for Gary to have it back!



Entry # 335 1957 Century Coronado owned by Stan Hatch of Sandpoint, ID. Stan has had this boat for 12 years. It had been on Priest Lake prior to debuting on Pend Oreille.





Entry # 330 "Oh Susanne" 1960 Newport Yacht owned by Bud & Susan Moon of Hope, ID. This is an Electric launch. Just a smooth quiet ride





Entry # 318 "Blarney" 1954 Chris Craft Riviera owned by Larry & Margaret O'Leary of Hayden, ID.

This boat was originally shipped to New York and mysteriously made it's way to the Pacific Northwest and was rescued from a backyard in Seattle in 1995.

Entry # 320 "Phantom" 1940 C. Shirley Racing Runabout owned by Robert Haynes of Renton, WA. This is a flat bottom racing runabout that ran in two classes – C service and D. C Service engine will be on show at this show....a 1940 Evinrude Speed Twin.



Entry # 322 " Fairbanks Meteor" 1997 built by Dave Berg and owned by Ron Ringel & Victoria Paulson of Hayden Lake, ID. This 1997 Draketail Launch was inspired by the 1902 racing boat Fairbanks No. 2 and features a restored 1938 Redwing Meteor 4-cyl 18hp engine. Not a Fast ride but a beautiful boat.





Entry # 317 "Goodoldaze" 1958 Chris Craft Sportsman Deluxe owned by Bob & Eileen Ickes of Post Falls, ID. This boat was originally owned by Bob's high school buddy. It was purchased and (barely) afloat in 1966 in Stockton CA. It was rebuilt by Bob in 1996 to 2000 and has been on Lake Coeur d'Alene.



Entry # 305 "Aphrodite" 1940 Chris Craft Sedan Cruiser owned by Kirk Marshall of Coeur d'Alene, ID. This boat has been on Pend Oreille since it was launched in 1940. Kirk is the 3<sup>rd</sup> owner and he began restoration on the



Entry # 307 "Sylvester" 1948 Chris Craft Racing Runabout owned by Jim & Kathie Thorpe of Long Beach, CA Jim learned to ski behind this boat in 1958 on Lake Tahoe while spending summers with his grandparents. Seams' boating is a family affair!

Entry # 308 "Happy Days" 1950 Chris Craft Sea Skiff owned by Jim & Charie Kerr of Sagle, ID The boat was originally from Wisconsin and brought to Seattle. Then is 1985 it was owned by Bud Moon and used as a demo boat for Rotary Marine. The Kerr's purchased it in 1996.



Entry # 309 "Bullmoose Jr." 1964 Lyman Sleeper owned Jim McGoldrick of Spokane, WA This boat was purchased new from the factory in 1964. It was run a couple of years and then sold to a friend who had it for 30 yrs and then we repurchased it and fired it up again. Entry # 306 **"Déjà vu"** 1947 Chris Craft Custom owned by Jerry Hanauska of Portland, OR. This is Jerry's 2<sup>nd</sup> Déjà vu and what a beauty it is.



Entry #310 "Rebel"

1950 Chris Craft Rivera owned by Bruce Reynolds of Spokane, WA This boat was found in Missoula, MT in October 2001 and in desperate need of restoration. Bruce has restored the boat and first put it in the water in June

2002.



Entry # 311 *"Whirlaway"* 1956 Chris Craft Deluxe Runabout owned by David Aull of Littleton, CO.

This boat was originally delivered in Michigan and spent it life there until 1999 when David purchased it. It still has the original engine with 820 hours, re-christened "Whirlaway" after the great 1941 Triple Crown winner.

#### <u>Shazam</u> <u>R 36, A McDonald Phantom</u>

I was asked to do a short history of my life. To tell you the truth I'm really honored. You'll have to excuse my story, as I'm getting quite old and some of my memories are a bit hazy. Even though I've been given a few complete makeovers or restorations as they are called, my memories are still those of an old soul. I hear this is the same with people. Anyway, I'll begin with my conception, which in itself is a bit of a story. You see Rocky Stone, who is historically considered the most famous race boat driver in my class, ever, had totally destroyed his Phantom, built by Shirley in Lafayette, Oregon. Shirley had been building these Phantoms since the 1930"s. His early boats were excellent. But as time went by, and Shirley became older, loosing his eyesight and attention to finer details, his boat building capabilities, deteriorated. So when Rocky needed a new boat, in the late 1940's, he went to a fellow named Wilbur McDonald, in Portland, Oregon. McDonald had worked with Shirley some, over the years. (The rumor is Shirley flat out refused to even talk to Rocky after he had smashed so many of his boats.) McDonald was a master cabinetmaker, an old time craftsman like you don't see much anymore, of these days. So McDonald agreed to make Rocky his new Phantom. Rocky put his famous winning R26 on it.

At this time my first owner, Fred Bishcof, who always dreamed of competing with Rocky decided to have McDonald build a Phantom for him. He put R36 on me, but never gave me a name. McDonald built two or three more like me, and then life took its toll on him. I'm not one to spread rumors, so I won't say what I have heard, not knowing if it's the truth or not. My memory is a bit foggy with Fred and I don't remember what happened during our life together, nor what ever happened to him or how long we were together.

But then John Laird bought me. John was in the same famous racing class as Rocky, the two of them had a great time competing in campaigns in the 1960's, all over the West Coast as well as Canada. I don't remember if John won any trophies, the few years we were together. John is a man that remains a hero to a lot of guys who are into these class C race boats. He actually has his own mini museum and had gained ownership of Rocky's Phantom, which he restored and donated to the Astoria Maritime museum. 
